Confession and Absolution

SERVICE OF THE WORD

In the service of the Word, God grants us His grace through the reading and preaching of His Word. Wherever His Word is, there He promises to be (Matt 18:20). The words of Holy Scripture are to "make [us] wise unto salvation (2 Timothy 3:15)." They do this but not by simply talking about Jesus but giving Jesus to us who crucified for our sins and raised for our justification. The Word of God is the Word of Life.

- Our risen Savior, before we ask anything of You, we lay before Your feet all our worship, adoration, praise, and thanksgiving.
- You not only sacrificed Your life for our sins on the cross, but You defeated death itself on the third day. For this, we bow before You, offering our thanks, praise, and service to You.
- **P** We pause to remember the events of the third day:
- The women at the tomb, Peter and John, the Emmaus road, the Upper Room.
- **P** In each case, You brought joy to those circumstances.
- Wherever we find ourselves today, Lord, remind us of what You did in the resurrection and fill our hearts with Your joy. Lord, hear our prayer.
- We remember before Your throne those whose joys are being stolen by the circumstances of life. We remember those sick and in need of Your care, [especially...].
- We lift up our brothers and sisters in Christ before Your throne, trusting in our great heavenly physician to use doctors, nurses, medicines, and miracles, according to Your will, to bring healing and health to them. Lord, hear our prayer.
- **P** For those who struggle every day, Lord Jesus, show compassion on them;
- Look with compassion on those struggling paycheck to paycheck; for the homeless, the ones living in poverty; and so many we have not named but are known to You, almighty God. Care for them as only You can. Lord, hear our prayer.
- **P** We pray for those who govern, both in our land and in others.
- We pray for world leaders and all in authority, that they would be guided by Your Spirit. Lord, hear our prayer.
- **P** We pray for those who are imprisoned, and we remember those imprisoned for nothing more than their faith in Jesus.

- As You showed grace to the thief on the cross, show Your grace to those imprisoned who do not know You. We ask protection for the ones persecuted for their faith. Lord, hear our prayer.
- **P** Into Your hands, O Lord, we commend all our requests.
- We pray these and all the prayers of our heart in the name of Jesus, risen on the third day, who with the Father and the Holy Spirit are one God, now and forever. Amen.

SOW and Grow

Week of April 20, 2025 (Row 31)

Romans 6:8-9

Now if we have died with Christ, we believe that we will also live with him. We know that Christ, being raised from the dead, will never die again; death no longer has dominion over him.

The bible color coding color of orange stands for prophecy, history, times, places, Kings, genealogy, people, numbers, covenants, vows, visions, oaths, future, and end times.

One underrated thing about death is that you only have to experience it one time. No dress rehearsals. No practice runs. No do overs. In verse 7 Paul tells us another good thing about death, "One who has died has been set free from sin." Paul has been making the argument in chapter 6 that since we were united with Christ in baptism we have died to sin. He is stating a declarative fact. It doesn't always feel that way to us, but we can claim that fact daily as we remember God's work in our baptism. We live our lives as simultaneously sinners and saints. Paul is exhorting the Romans to lean into their sainthood while daily drowning the sinner through repentance and remembrance of your baptism (v.11).

But wait there's more! Paul also lets us know that since we have died with Christ in our baptism we will also be resurrected eternally as he is so we ought not fear death. I'm not afraid of death, you may say, but the anticipation is killing me! We do tend to suffer more from the anticipation and worry about death than the actual event. Our SOW verse this week lets us know that we are free from fear with regards to death for we will share in Christ's resurrection. Like Christ, Death no longer has dominion over us. Luther cites Romans 6 in the Small Catechism explanation of baptism. "What does such baptizing with water indicate? It indicates that the Old Adam in us should by daily contrition and repentance be drowned and die with all sins and evil desires, and that a new man should daily emerge and arise to live before God in righteousness and purity forever."

Pray: Lord, we thank you that in our baptism we are free to live our lives fully. Free from sin, free from death, and free from the worry of death. Amen.
